MATERIALS

- Yarn: 3 skeins of <u>Nako Vega Stripe in color 82418</u> (100% acrylic, 213 yds/195m per skein) or any weight 4 acrylic or acrylic blend yarn
- Size US K/10.5 (6.5mm) crochet hook
- Stitch markers
- Tapestry needle

GAUGE

16 sts = 4 in/10 cm

FINISHED DIMENSIONS

Bag measures 18 in (46 cm) wide and 20 in (151 cm) from top of handle to bottom edge.

ABBREVIATIONS

All Cathedrals & Cafes patterns are written in standard US terms.

Blo Back loop only

Ch Chain

Hdc Half double crochet

Sc Single crochet

SI st Slip stitch

St(s) Stitch/Stitches

Ws Wrong side

NOTES

Bag is worked in one flat rectangle and then folded into shape and seamed. Handle is crocheted and attached last. Round/Row numbers start over for simplicity.

PATTERN

Ch 52.

Row 1 Hdc in second chain from hook and in each chain across. Ch 1,

turn. (51 hdc)


Row 2 Hdc in blo of each st across. Ch 1, turn. (51 sts)


Row 3 - 100 Repeat row 2

Fasten off.

Construction

Fold point A to meet B, and fold point C to meet D as shown in photo 1. You should have a trapezoid shape as shown in photo 2.





Fold bottom right corner up until AB meets CD as shown in photo 3.

Line up hdc rows (using stitch markers may help) and attach yarn at top middle "v" as shown in photo 4. Seam from top middle "v" to bottom corner evenly with sc join.

Fasten off.

Repeat seam from top middle "v" to bottom corner on other side. Fasten off.





Top edging

Round 1

Join yarn to top right corner of bag in first hdc. Ch 1, sc 1 in same stitch as join. Sc in each hdc down to middle "v" (51 sc). At middle "v" sc2tog. Sc 51 evenly up left side to top left corner. Sc in each hdc down back left side to middle "v" (51 sc). At middle "v" sc2tog. Sc 51 evenly up left side to top left corner.

Round 2 Sc around. (206 sc)

Round 3

Sc 49, sc2tog, puff stitch, sc2tog, sc 49 to top corner, sc 49 down other side, sc2tog, puff stitch, sc2tog, sc to top corner.

Fasten off.

<u>Handle</u>

Row 1

Join yarn at third stitch from center stitch at one of the top corners, ch 1, sc 1 in same stitch as join as shown in photo 5. Sc 6, ch 1, turn. (7 sc).




Row 2-40 Sc 7, ch1, turn. (7 sc)

Without twisting handle, line handle edge up with center stitch of other top corner. Turn your work so the ws is facing. Pull yarn through the third stitch from the right of the center stitch, ch 1, and make 1 sc into both the first stitch of the handle and third stitch of top corner to begin securing handle to opposite side. You are essentially seaming with a single crochet join on the ws so the join matches the look of the other side. See photos 6, 7 and 8. Fasten off, weave in all ends.









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
